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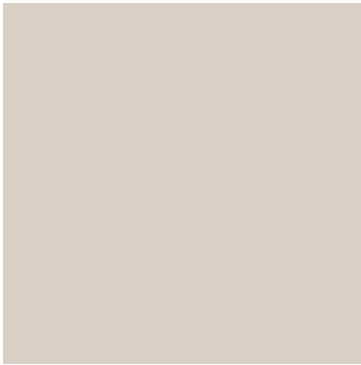
# Interior Design *Trends* for 2026

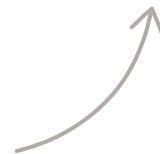

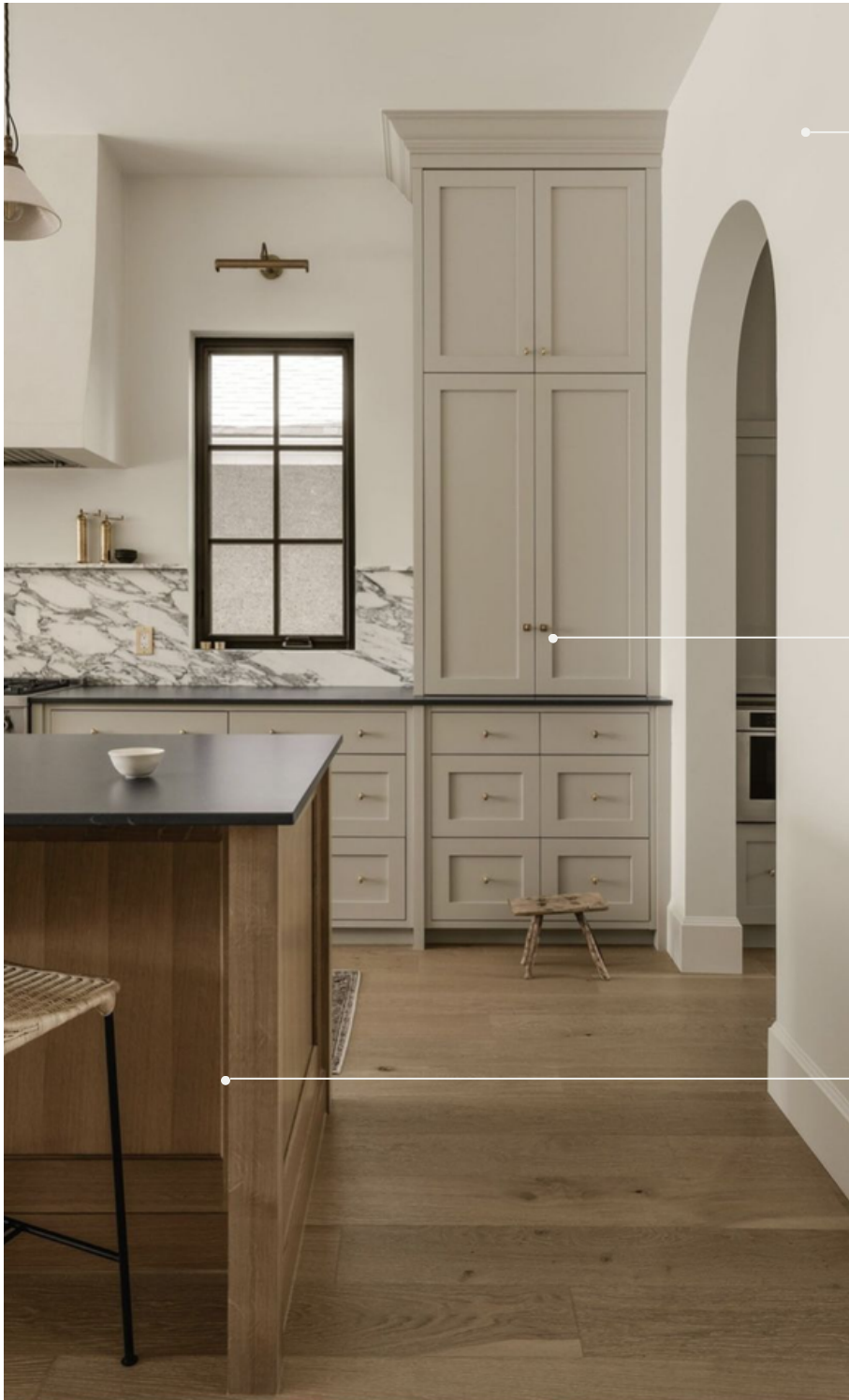

*Tip:* When choosing your stone, select a base colour that is a few shades lighter than Hog Bristle (approximately 3-4 shades lighter) and ensure the veining aligns with the undertone in Polytec Jasmine for a harmonious look.



## Dulux Natural White

Tip: Colour flooding, achieved by applying the same hue to the walls, skirting and ceiling, serves as an excellent backdrop for traditional interiors. This approach allows for the intricate details of the joinery work to take center stage as the true highlight of the design.

*Tip:* Modern kitchens often embrace a minimalist aesthetic. To prevent the finish from appearing too flat, use a textured grain finish such as 'Ravine.' This option will introduce detail, adding depth and visual interest to your space.

*Tip:* It's best to use matte surfaces in low-traffic areas, as they can be prone to marking and printing. For high-traffic zones, opt for a coated and textured finish to maintain a beautiful appearance in your kitchen every day.
